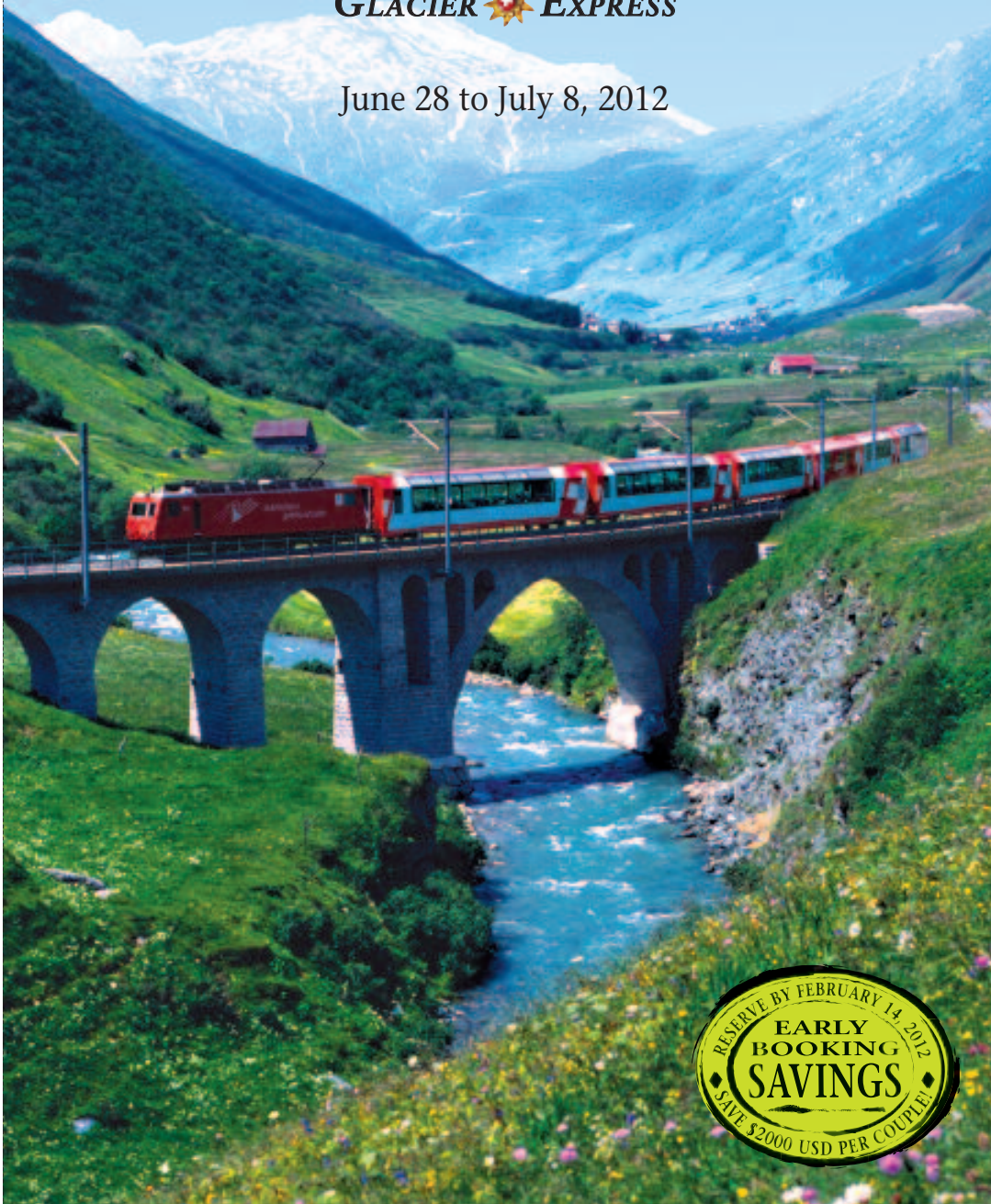

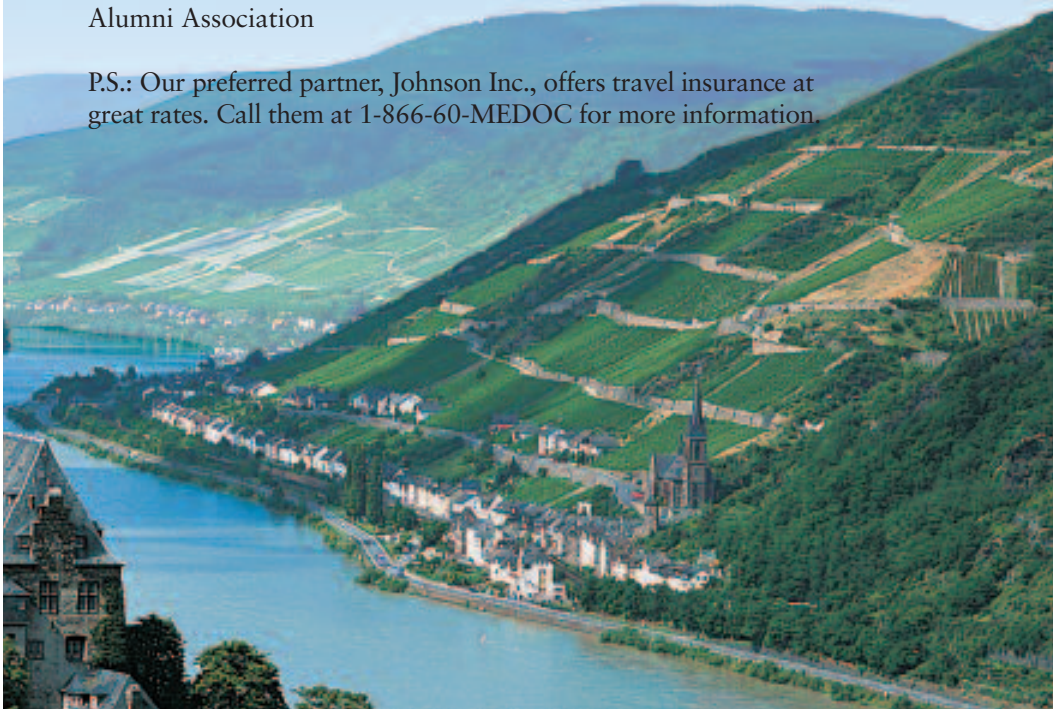

Canada/ Geneva, Switzerland/Zermatt Thursday and Friday, June 28 and 29

Depart Canada for Geneva. Following your morning arrival, transfer through the heart of the Swiss Alps to the village of Täsch. Board a shuttle train for the brief journey to the Alpine resort of Zermatt, dramatically located beneath the craggy pinnacle of the iconic Matterhorn. Check into the chalet-style HOTEL SCHWEIZERHOF for the welcome reception and dinner in the hotel.

Zermatt

Saturday, June 30

Today, travel aboard the famous *Gornergrat Bahn*, the highest cog railway in Europe. Ascend through forests of pine and larch and cross meadows ablaze with wildflowers to the 3,000-metre-high Gornergrat, stopping en route at Riffelberg for the panoramic view of Monte Rosa and the majestic Matterhorn. From the observatory atop the Gornergrat, look out over sweeping vistas of Europe's most breathtaking Alpine scenery—the serrated profiles of the Matterhorn, the Liskamm and Dufourspitze mountains and vast Gorner Glacier. Following lunch, return to Zermatt at your leisure.

Zermatt/Andermatt/ Lucerne

Sunday, July 1

Board the fabled *Glacier Express*, “the world's slowest fast train,” and travel through the heart of the Alps, where the natural beauty of the mountains rivals the skill and ingenuity of the engineers who created this rail route across Europe's most challenging terrain—a task requiring the construction of 291 bridges and 91 tunnels.

Arrive in Andermatt early this afternoon. After lunch, travel by motorcoach to Lucerne, and check into the lakeside deluxe HOTEL SCHWEIZERHOF.

Lucerne

Monday, July 2

A long-favoured destination for travellers, Lucerne is set against the backdrop of its deep blue lake and the rugged grandeur of Mounts Pilatus and Rigi. Begin your morning walking tour in the Weinmarkt (Wine Market), surrounded by historic burghers' houses. See the Hofkirche (Court Church), one of the finest examples of Swiss Renaissance architecture, and the Lion Monument, dedicated to the Swiss Guards who gave their lives defending Louis XVI during the French Revolution. Walk across Lucerne's most famous landmark, the delightful, 14th-century wooden Chapel Bridge, which spans the Reuss River and is adorned with mediaeval paintings.

Ascend Mount Pilatus by panoramic gondola to its 2,100-metre summit for a magnificent 360-degree panorama of central Switzerland's mountains, peaks, forests and lakes. Enjoy lunch in a summit restaurant and free time. Board the *Pilatus Railway*, the world's steepest cogwheel railway, then descend more than 1,600 metres in under five kilometres on return to the shores of Lake Lucerne, where you will enjoy a scenic cruise.

Lucerne/Interlaken/ Berne/Basel

Tuesday, July 3

This morning, cross the scenic Bernese Oberland to the charming resort of Interlaken, set astride an isthmus separating Lake Thun from Lake Brienz.

From here, enjoy a scenic transfer across the rolling Swiss countryside to Berne, Switzerland's historic capital. Lunch is in the historic Restaurant Kornhauskeller, a former granary. Visit the Old Town, a UNESCO World Heritage site and beautifully preserved mediaeval gem noted for its arcaded sidewalks. Continue the journey to Basel. Upon arrival, embark the deluxe M.S. AMADEUS PRINCESS and join fellow participants this evening for the Captain's Welcome Reception.

Strasbourg, France **Wednesday, July 4**

The lively Alsatian city of Strasbourg fuses the Old and the New Europe. The Old City, a UNESCO World Heritage site, is a treasure trove of mediaeval houses, and the charming Ponts-Couverts, covered bridges flanked by watchtowers at each end, span the picturesque canals. It was in Strasbourg that John Calvin first established a reformed parish, and the beautiful Protestant Church of

St-Pierre-le-Vieux testifies to the city's history of religious tolerance. See the graceful sandstone Catholic Cathedral of Notre Dame, a Romanesque-Gothic masterpiece that according to the poet Goethe, rises "like a most sublime, wide-arching tree of God." In the Petite-France district, the historic millers', tanners' and fishermen's quarter along the Ill River, the fairy-tale look of a past era lives on, while nearby, 27 nations engage in spirited debates in the European Union Parliament.

Enjoy lunch aboard ship. The afternoon is free for independent pursuits. Depart from Strasbourg.

Mannheim (Heidelberg), Germany **Thursday, July 5**

This morning, arrive in Mannheim and depart for Heidelberg, where luminaries such as Goethe and Schumann came to experience the intellectual atmosphere of Heidelberg University, Germany's

oldest, founded in 1386. To many on the “Grand Tour” of Europe, fashionable in the 18th and 19th centuries, Heidelberg was Germany. Nestled in the densely wooded valley of the Neckar River, this city epitomized the spirit of German Romanticism. Heidelberg has preserved its authentic Renaissance-Baroque character, including the nine arches of the famous Alte Brücke (Old Bridge) that still span the Neckar River. Visit imposing Heidelberg Castle, a magnificent, 13th-century edifice perched above the river. The stately ruins preserve Heidelberg's links to its mediaeval past.

Reboard the ship in Mannheim and cruise to Rudesheim.

Rudesheim/Koblentz **Friday, July 6**

Go ashore this morning in the mediaeval town of Rudesheim, the heart of Germany's wine country. Join a guided tour aboard the unique, “Winzerexpress” mini train and travel past beautiful countryside vineyards, historic palaces and castles, followed by a private tasting of local wines.

Sail through the Rhine River Valley, a UNESCO World Heritage site, legendary for its scenery and riverside architectural treasures. Cruise past the mediaeval castles, tranquil villages and terraced vineyards, and see the famous Lorelei Rock—ancient lore holds that a beautiful maiden lured sailors here with her enchanting song.

Dock in Koblentz, another reminder of Germany's Roman past. Established in nine B.C. during the reign of Augustus Caesar, it occupies a strategic location at the confluence of the Rhine and Moselle rivers. From the famous Deutsches Eck (German Corner), where the two rivers meet, enjoy a

view of the impressive 17th-century fortress of Ehrenbreitstein, once the residence of the powerful Archbishop-Electors of Trier. The twin-towered Basilica of St. Castor, built between the 11th and 13th centuries, features the Rhineland's distinctive style of Romanesque architecture. Depart Koblentz this evening.

Cologne **Saturday, July 7**

Early this morning, arrive in Cologne, one of Germany's most ancient cities, founded as a Roman military outpost in 38 B.C. From the time of Charlemagne to present day, it has flourished as the Rhineland's foremost mercantile and religious centre. The city is the birthplace of the world-famous eau-de-cologne perfume. The historic Kölner Dom (cathedral) is a UNESCO World Heritage site and the finest example of High Gothic architecture in Germany. Explore the Altstadt (Old Town) and visit the cathedral, for which construction began in 1248 and

M.S. AMADEUS PRINCESS

The elegance and romance of Mozart's music was inspiration in the meticulous crafting of the deluxe M.S. AMADEUS PRINCESS, which sets new standards in design and technology, and features the comforts of a floating five-star hotel.

This ship offers 80 outside air-conditioned, stylishly appointed Staterooms (from 161 square feet) and Suites (up to 236 square feet).

Most accommodations feature a floor-to-ceiling sliding glass door with French balcony (iron railing) and all have two twin beds (convertible to one queen bed), a private bathroom with shower (Suites have bathtub with shower), individual climate control, satellite telephone and television, writing desk, safe and hair dryer.

Meals are served in single, unassigned seatings in the elegant Panorama Restaurant, where passengers can enjoy the passing landscape through floor-to-ceiling windows. Highly skilled chefs prepare continental cuisine featuring local ingredients. Meals include early-risers' coffee, buffet breakfast, lunch, afternoon tea, dinner and late-evening snack. Complimentary wine is served with dinner.

Public facilities are spacious and include a lounge and bar that opens onto the Panorama Deck, a library, Internet Café, beauty salon, boutique and fitness studio with massage services and early-morning exercise classes. The Sun Deck features the Lido Bar, an outdoor dipping pool, golf putting green and walking track.

The international English-speaking crew provides warm hospitality and personalized service. The M.S. AMADEUS PRINCESS meets the highest safety standards and is one of a few European river ships to have been awarded the ecological "Green Certifications" stamp of quality for environment sustainability efforts.

SWISS ALPINE RAILWAYS *Marvels of Engineering*

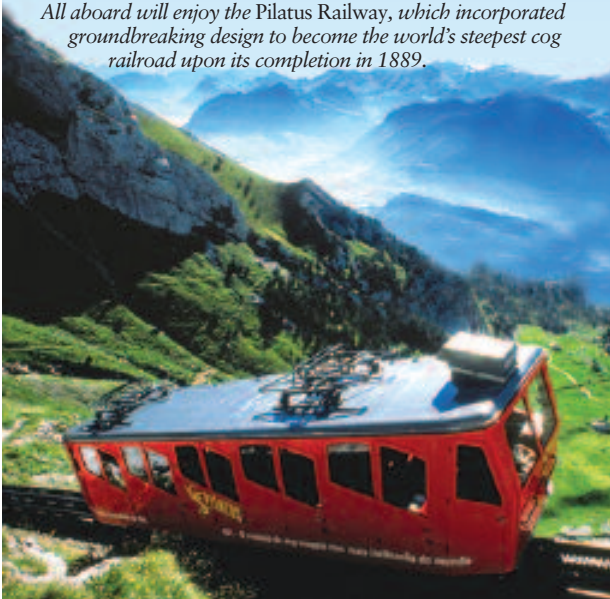
Awesome. Breathtaking. Dynamic.

Superlatives that describe not only Switzerland's majestic 4,200-metre-high mountain peaks, flowing streams, cavernous gorges and crystalline glaciers, but also three of the world's great cogwheel railways—the panoramic *Glacier Express*, the scenic *Gornergrat Bahn* and the dramatic *Pilatus Railway*—and the ingenuity and engineering achievements it took to create them. Appreciate the visionary work and vast scope of these magnificent railways as you experience the sublime majesty of the iconic Alps from incredible perspectives up-close.

The *Gornergrat Bahn* is Switzerland's oldest (since 1898) electrified cog railway. In the brief span of 11 kilometres, you will climb 1,486 metres from Zermatt to the lofty Gornergrat. En route, look for stunning views of the great Matterhorn, hanging glaciers and the robin's-egg blue waters of mountain lakes. Lucerne's *Pilatus Railway*, completed in 1889, offers breathtaking bird's-eye views of Swiss farms and coniferous forests during its five-kilometre run from the shores of Lake Lucerne to the summit of Mount Pilatus. Its vertical ascent of 1,600 metres over a grade as steep as 48 percent is highlighted by its stunning 360-degree views.

No feat, however, required greater skill and determination than the laying of the track for the *Glacier Express* in 1930 across the spine of the towering Alps. Enjoy this spectacular and leisurely journey showcasing unmatched views of the Swiss countryside: weathered chalets and mountainside farming hamlets, picturesque trails dotted with hikers, livestock grazing on green grasses, and ice-blue snow-capped mountains. A true engineering marvel, the railway penetrates the mountain barrier separating the cantons of Valais and Uri through the 15-kilometre-long Furka Tunnel and crosses arched stone bridges that span the tumbling headwaters of the rivers Rhine and Rhône.

All aboard will enjoy the Pilatus Railway, which incorporated groundbreaking design to become the world's steepest cog railroad upon its completion in 1889.

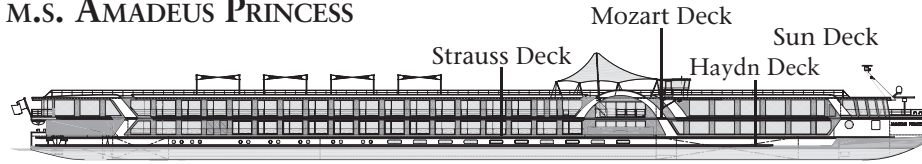
