

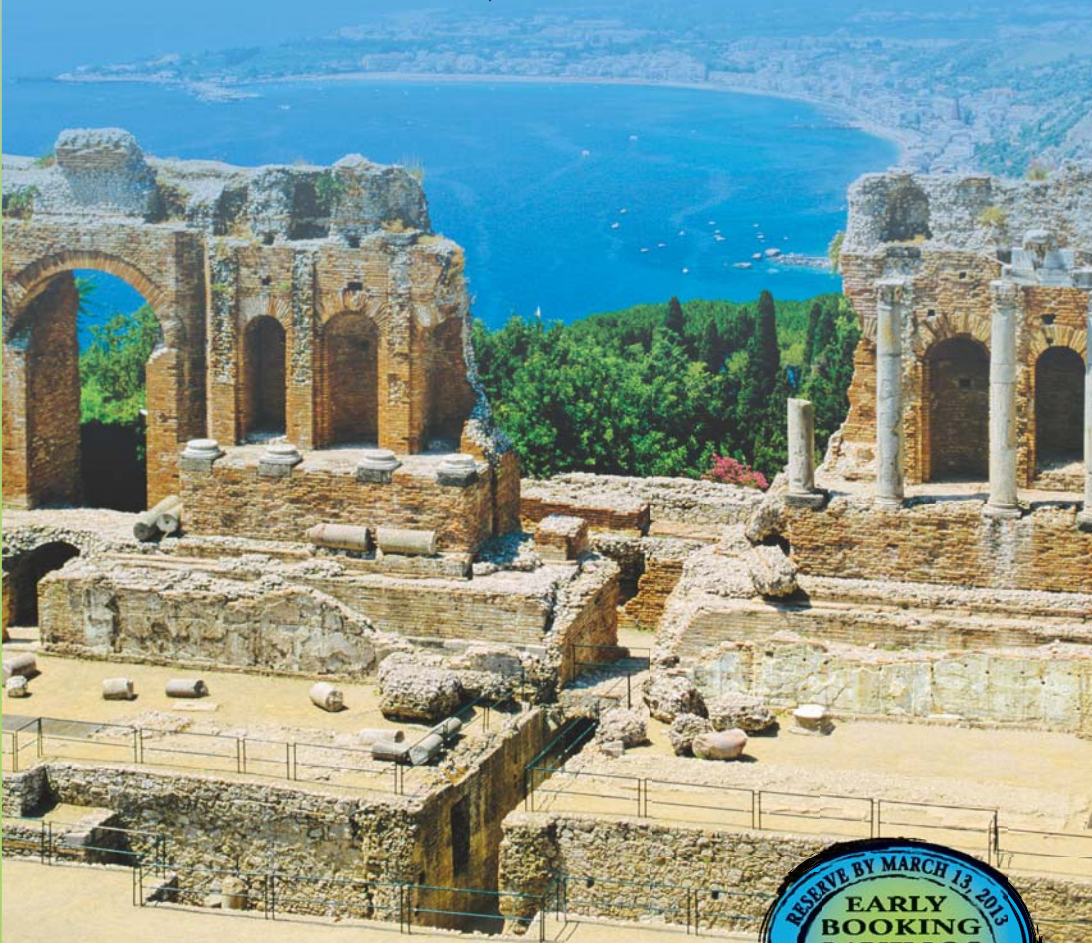

Once the centre of a vast empire, today Rome is a UNESCO World Heritage site and the historic heart of Italy. From the iconic structures of the Colosseum and the Vatican, to the Spanish Steps and the Catacombs, the remains of ancient Rome still humble modern visitors.

Pompeii

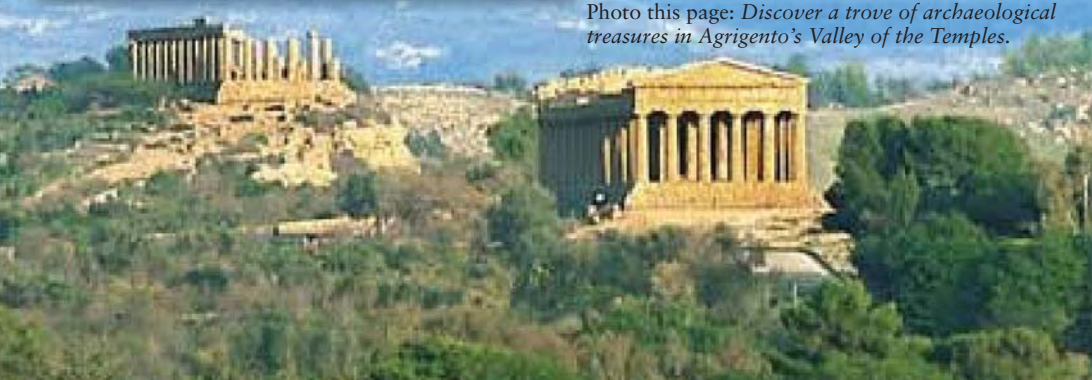
The incredibly well-preserved ruins of this ancient Roman city were buried by the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in A.D. 79. Discovered and excavated 17 centuries later, Pompeii, a UNESCO World Heritage site, provides an intimate look at daily life during Roman times. See the impressive amphitheatre, the house of the wealthy Vettii family and the extraordinary Temple of Jupiter.

Capri, Italy

Amid the isle of Capri's dramatic scenery, lush vegetation and subtropical climate, the Roman Emperors Augustus and Tiberius maintained elegant retreats. By small boat, visit Capri's most famous attraction, the legendary Grotta Azzura (Blue Grotto), a sea cave

Taormina, Sicily

The charming, medieval town of Taormina commands one of the most impressive settings on the island and is the 2,400-year-old centre of Sicilian culture and commerce. Look for imposing, snow-covered Mt. Etna, Europe's highest volcano, and enjoy stunning panoramic views of Calabria. Visit the remarkably preserved Greco-Roman Theatre, built in the third century B.C. and still in use today, located in perhaps one of the finest settings of any ancient Roman settlement on Earth. Admire the 14th-century Corvaia Palace, an ornate, Gothic-Catalan structure; the medieval Baroque portal of the Cathedral of St. Nicola; and the Roman Odeon, known as the "small theatre." Stroll along Taormina's famous Corso Umberto, the bustling shopping thoroughfare with a distinctive Mediterranean flair.

Siracusa, Sicily

Extolled for its beauty and grandeur from antiquity to the present, Siracusa traces its origin to Greek colonists from Corinth who settled here in 734 B.C. It reached its zenith of wealth and power 350 years

whose interior is adorned with classic statues and the tranquil blue-hued waters that gave the grotto its name.

Amalfi, Italy

The stunning Amalfi Coast, a UNESCO World Heritage site, features spectacular natural views along this winding cornice of Italy's Mediterranean coastline and epitomizes the allure of the Italian seaside. Admire the dramatic cliffs, secluded villages, opulent villas and sun-dappled beaches. Enjoy time on your own in the lovely village of Positano, an exclusive and elegant retreat that was frequently visited by artists such as Picasso, Toscanini and Bernstein, popularized by John Steinbeck and now a favourite resort of international luminaries.

Stromboli, Italy

Tonight, the ship cruises in view of the most famous of the UNESCO World Heritage-designated Aeolian Islands, Stromboli, known as the "Lighthouse of the Mediterranean" for the spectacular light display of its mildly active volcano.

Syracuse's "Old City," Ortygia is a pedestrian-friendly island separated from mainland Sicily by a narrow channel. The charming streets and plazas are filled with Greek, Roman and Baroque architecture styles.

later under Dionysius the Elder, who fortified his city with 22-kilometre-long walls and made it a centre of philosophy and the arts. Today, Siracusa is a virtual open-air museum of classical monuments and a UNESCO World Heritage site.

Visit the magnificent Greek Theatre, where Aeschylus once spoke to ancient Siracusans; the Roman Amphitheatre, where gladiators competed for the crowds; the Altar of Hieron II, the limestone cave known as Ear of Dionysius; and the Archaeological Museum. Then, enjoy a walking tour of the historic quarter of Ortygia, the city's maritime heart, where the sixth-century B.C. Temple of Apollo stands as the finest example of Doric architecture in western Europe.

Agrigento, Sicily

The world of classical antiquity comes alive in Agrigento's legendary Valle dei Templi (Valley of the Temples), a UNESCO World Heritage site. Here, no fewer than eight Doric Greek shrines dating from the fifth century B.C. dot the landscape, including the Temple of Hera, with its graceful northern

colonnade, and the Temple of Concordia, a beautifully preserved Greek monument. There are temples dedicated to Zeus and Heracles and the Sanctuary of the Chthonic Divinities, ancient Greek lords of Earth and the underworld. Visit the Archaeological Museum and admire the collection of Greek, Etruscan, Phoenician, Carthaginian and Roman artifacts.

Valletta, Malta

The magnificent fortified city of Valletta was founded in 1566 by the French Grand Master of the Order of the Knights of St. John after their victory over the Ottomans in the Great Siege of Malta. This UNESCO World Heritage site was one of the world's earliest planned cities and today showcases architecture from the 16th century onward, including splendid examples of Baroque, neoclassical and modern styles.

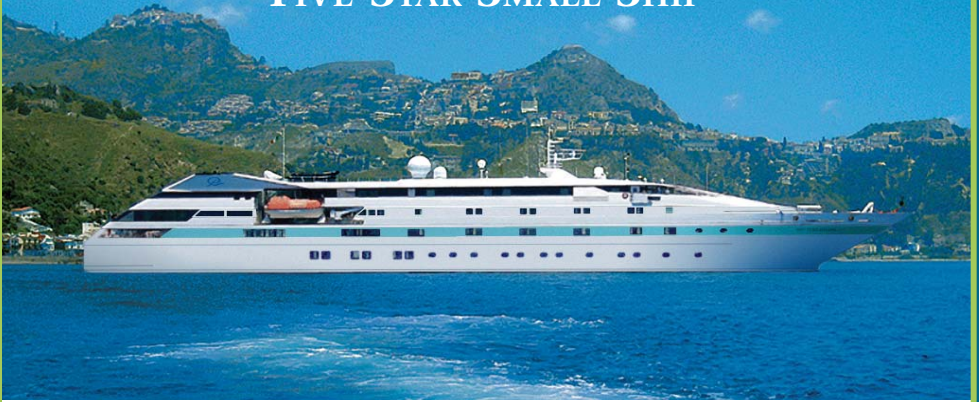
Tour the Megalithic temples of Malta, a UNESCO World Heritage site including Hagar Qim and the Tarxien Temples built in 3000 B.C. Also, see the Palace of the Inquisitor, built to house the law courts of the Order of St. John.

This afternoon, walk through the colonnaded Lower Barrakka Gardens, offering magnificent vistas of Valletta and its harbour, and the striking Grand Master's Palace. Enjoy a private, family-led tour of Casa Rocca Piccola.

The excavation of Pompeii has provided detailed insight into the life of a city at the height of the Roman Empire.

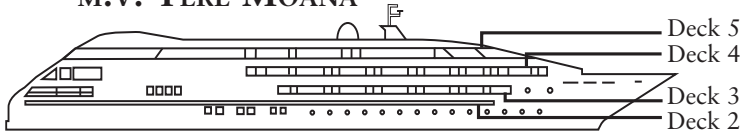
