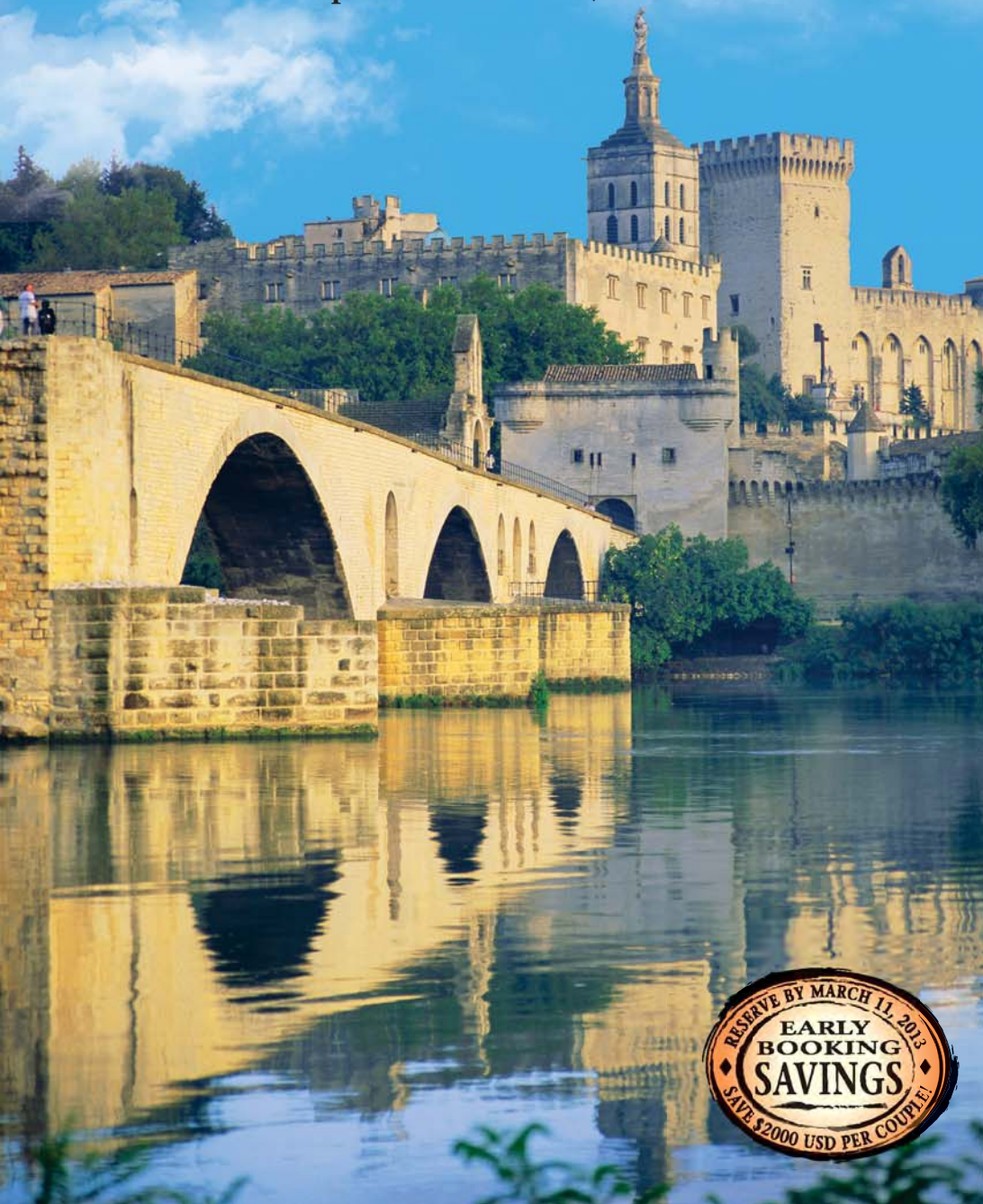

This evening, enjoy a Welcome Reception.

Paris

Wednesday, September 18

What began as a small, isolated Celtic farming settlement on an island in the Seine River grew over the centuries into one of the greatest cities in the world. Its Latin motto, *Fluctuat nec mergitur* (“It is tossed about, but does not sink”) sums up Paris’ colourful and dramatic history. Today, this truly cosmopolitan city, where past and present coexist in harmony, welcomes visitors from all over the globe.

After breakfast, see Paris’ most legendary monuments and sites. Admire the soaring grace of the Eiffel Tower’s black iron lace, built for the Universal Exhibition of 1889; imposing Notre Dame a UNESCO World Heritage site located on Île de la Cité, a small natural island in the historic Seine River; and the lovely, bustling Place de la Concorde.

From Renoir to Rodin to Van Gogh and Manet, the creative flowering of the 19th and early 20th centuries come to life in the splendid Musée d’Orsay,

a spectacular repository of paintings, sculptures and decorative arts located in the brilliantly renovated, turn-of-the-century Orléans railroad terminus. View one of the world’s preeminent collections of Impressionist, Realist, Art Nouveau and Art Deco art and learn more about how these artistic movements reflected the revolutionary social, cultural and political times.

This afternoon is at leisure to further explore the treasures of Paris at your own pace or join the optional excursion to visit the Château de Versailles, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Enjoy a guided tour of Louis XIV’s architecturally stunning palace and its exquisitely sculpted gardens.

Paris/Lyon

Thursday, September 19

Transfer to the Gare de Lyon and board the TGV (“Train à Grande Vitesse”) high-speed train to Lyon. Its aerodynamic, sleek design enables it to reach speeds of 322 kilometres per hour, making the TGV one of France’s greatest technological achievements.

Arrive in Lyon, a UNESCO World Heritage site, the dramatic gateway to Provence located at the confluence of the Rhône and Saône rivers. From lofty Fourvière Hill (Praying Hill), see the ornate 19th-century Basilica of Notre Dame and the restored Vieux Lyon (Old Lyon), where almost 300 elegant Gothic and Renaissance mansions attest to the wealth of Lyon’s long-standing silk industry. Walk through the ancient quarters of St. Jean, St. Paul and St. Georges, which are linked by charming *traboules*—narrow, covered pedestrian passageways.

Chalon-sur-Saône for Beaune

Friday, September 20

This morning, visit the enchanting medieval Château de La Rocheptot. Originally built as a castle, this magnificent château features traditional Burgundian glazed tiles, a Romanesque chapel and Renaissance furniture. Continue to nearby Beaune, a bustling community founded in the fifth century B.C. in the famous Côte d'Or *département* and the longtime capital of Burgundy wines. A stroll through this city of art reveals historic mansions and medieval half-timbered houses. Tour the exquisite 15th-century Hôtel-Dieu, a quintessential example of Burgundian Renaissance architecture, distinguished by its dazzling, multicoloured glazed roof tiles. Its meticulously restored chambers provide a fascinating

glimpse into hospital life during the 15th century and hold an impressive collection of period art, including the brilliant *Last Judgment* by Rogier van der Weyden.

The afternoon is at leisure in the historic wine-producing town of Chalon-sur-Saône.

Montmerle for Beaujolais Saturday, September 21

From the lovely vineyards of the province of Beaujolais des Pierres Dorées, the land of the "golden stones," come France's youngest and fruitiest wines. In some seasons, this internationally recognized wine region along the Saône produces more red wine than the Burgundy regions of Chablis, Côte d'Or, Côte Châlonnaise and Mâconnais combined. Travel over verdant rolling hills into the heart of the church-spired Beaujolais region to enjoy a private tour of the historic Château de Montmels and savour the château's wines and a tasting of local cheese and charcuterie while an internationally recognized recording artist performs a specially arranged, private fortepiano concert.

Located on the banks of the Saône River, Lyon blends 2000-year-old history with contemporary architecture and style. France's sophisticated second city is filled with museums, art galleries, boutiques and haute cuisine.





At the heart of the world famous wine region, you can produce wine there today.



Built as a charitable almshouse in 1443 and now a museum, the Hôtel-Dieu remains a medieval jewel of Burgundy with its spectacular glazed-tile roof and picturesque courtyard.

Viviers for Orange/Avignon Sunday, September 22

Experience the stunning beauty of Provence's aged stucco dwellings painted peach, raspberry, rose, or green – and accented by shutters in every hue of blue. Arrive in Viviers for an excursion to the UNESCO World Heritage sites in the Roman city of Orange. Visit the well-preserved, ancient Roman Theatre, still hosting performances today, and see the Roman Triumphal Arch, built in the late first century as a tribute to Augustus and a symbol of Roman imperial glory.

Continue to Pont du Gard, also a UNESCO World Heritage site. This exquisitely built 2,000-year-old Roman aqueduct until recently supplied over 150 million litres of water daily to the city of Nîmes. Its magnificent structure was constructed of stones made to fit together seamlessly without mortar and makes clever use of arches to support the weight.

Following lunch on board the ship, transfer to Avignon, where during the 14th century the city became the centre of western Christendom when Pope Clement V arrived here after fleeing the turmoil of Rome in 1309. The next six pontiffs enlarged the city into one of the richest and most powerful in Europe, until the Great Schism with Rome in 1378 led to the eventual end of the Avignon Papacy in 1405. The walking tour visits the grandiose Palais des Papes (Papal Palace), one of the largest châteaux-forts built in Europe during the Gothic era, the primary reflection of Avignon's golden age and one of the most famous landmarks in France. Walk to the nearby splendid Garden of the Popes and the Rocher des Domes, which offers panoramic views of the Rhône River Valley. At the river's edge see the remaining four arches of the famous Pont d'Avignon one of the most beautiful bridges

constructed during the Middle Ages. You can stroll along the well-preserved, 14th-century ramparts, one of the finest surviving examples of medieval fortification still encircling Avignon. Dinner is on board and the evening is at leisure in Avignon.

Avignon/Arles Monday, September 23

Few places on Earth can match the distinctive joie de vivre of Arles. This archetypal Provençal city is home to one of the most majestic Roman monuments in France, the Amphitheatre, built in the first century B.C. It is the largest constructed in France and second only to Rome's Colosseum in magnificence and grandeur. Arles' 12th-century Cathedral of St. Trophime has a fascinating Last Judgement-themed portal, one of the finest examples of Romanesque sculpture. Between 1888 and 1889 Vincent van Gogh lived in Arles and the subject of his famous *Night Café* painting is still open for business on the lively Boulevard des Lices.

The Captain's Farewell Reception and Dinner is on board the ship this evening.

Arles/Marseilles/Canada Tuesday, September 24

Disembark and continue on the Aix-en-Provence Post-Program Option or transfer to the airport in Marseilles for your flight home.

Arles' Romanesque architecture reflects its history as an important port of call on the Roman road from Italy to Spain.

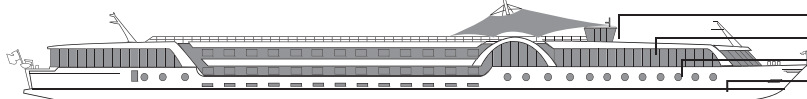
